THE 1963 ANNUAL MEETING

The fortieth annual meeting of the West Texas Historical Association was held on Saturday, May 4, 1963, in the Nancy Smith Elementary School at Albany. Thexelinxhxeesimmxwasxeahledmtom President W. Earl Brown called the first session to order at 9:30 were on hund A. M. Seventy-eight persons heard the four papers presented/ during the morning. At 11:00 o'clock two buses carried the group to visit the interesting and edifying Albany-Shackelford ounty Historical ExhibitxxxWhilemememxhwaxhkaxprnepxhedxhkaxmanxmahm and to hear a delightful calliope concert by Rob. Areex Mr. Bob Green. The visitors then returned to the amainm school auditiorium koxinearofoamxilimilikalimamxamolxfoakaxm where they were entertained by the "Seven Harps," a local group of young ladies, with a rendition of four Civil War and folk songs.

At the luncheon session in the school cafeteria 128 persons heard an interesting and provocative address entitled "One World and the French Revolution" by Dr. John C. Stevens, Assistant

President of Abilene Christian College. During a short business meeting the Sectetary-Treasumer's favorable report was adopted withoutxany and officers, as recommended by a nominating committee headed by Mr. Ben O. Grant, were named. Mr. Ernest Lee of Wichita

Falls was elected president, Mr. John Berry of Clyde was elected to fill the vice-presidency vacated by Mr. Lee, and Mr. Brown was given the vacant place on the Executive Council. All other incumbent officers were re-elected. Editor Repart Richardson explained that most business was considred by the Executive Committee each year prior to the annual meeting, and stressed the need for additional members. There were at the time 129 individual and 87 library members.

A motion by Mr. Grant to establish the price of all Year Books at \$5.00 per copy carried.
